Commission to Host Virtual Town Hall on Mental Health and Addiction

(Rochester, New York) - The Commission on Racial and Structural Equity (RASE) will host a virtual Zoom Community Voices Session, 6 to 8 p.m., tomorrow, Thursday, Oct. 8. The Mental Health and Addiction Workgroup of the Commission is seeking to capture the personal experiences and ideas of community members to better understand how structural racism and inequities have prevented individuals and families from receiving the best available care for mental health and substance use problems.

"I am excited to hear from the citizens of this community who want to join us in overcoming systemic and institutional inequities as well as racism in our city and our county," said RASE Cochair Dr. Mohammad Shafiq. "We are at a tipping point and this input and feedback will help the Commission develop recommendations for policies and laws that are inclusive of the community's specific needs."

The virtual Community Voices Session includes a panel of behavioral health experts, community leaders, as well as children and family advocates who will answer questions and offer feedback to the community.
